Many of us remember two week revivals and tent meetings. My Grandmother was a Baptist, but she was one of eight with 4 Pentecostal Preacher brothers. My favorite aunt, Lynette had no children so she shared my Grandmother's family and took us to the Pentecostal church every Saturday night. I have to say her church was very lively and the services were very long. My Aunt had a large growth on her cheek for years and at one of her church's Revivals, people lined up for healing. The preacher prayed for her and that night it fell off in the bed between she and I. The uncles had many spirited discussions at family dinners about the need to speak in tongues to be saved. Whether we speak in tongues or not, heartfelt praise and worship is the mark of a real experience of the Holy Spirit. Charismatic renewal is their relentless emphasis on the truth that receiving the gift of the Holy Spirit is *a real life changing experience*. It is not merely the performance of rituals and sacraments. It is the life changing experience of the Holy Spirit through faith in Jesus Christ.

Acts 2:38-41 Peter replied, "Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins. And you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. 39: the

promise is for you and your children and for all who are far off- for all whom the Lord our God will call."

The word of God must be heard. In God's plan Jesus was crucified, raised, and exalted, as Lord over all the universe and he bought forgiveness of our sins and spiritual renewal on the cross.

Having the Holy Spirit within us makes our lives so much fuller and happier. What Jesus does teach in Acts 1:5 is that the experience of baptism in the Spirit will bring power to witness into the Christian life. I think we can all use more witness power. I do know for a fact that if we ASK Him for help he will come to our aid as our faithful Father. Each month as I write this column, I pray "Dear Father, what can I say this month?" and something just "pops up". Beth Moore taught me when I started to read my Bible or do my homework to ask God to open my mind and speak to me through his words and I believe that is the Holy Spirit.

Oh, by the way, does anyone remember that vacation bible school lasted two weeks in our day? We got a Dixie cup that we planted with a zinnia seed and we watered it daily and in two weeks we had flowers. Be sure to tell Kellee!




Flower Ministry


Service projects on this tour included cleaning, painting and even gardening. Those who were able picked their favorite chore and pitched in with 'gusto.'

SIGNS OF A STROKE

- F** Face Drooping. Ask the person to smile. Is the smile even?
- A** Arm weakness. Ask the person to raise both arms above head. Look for any drooping or unevenness.
- S** Speech difficulty – Is speech slurred? Is the person unable to speak or hard to understand? Ask person to repeat a simple sentence, like "The sky is blue."
- T** Time to call **9-1-1**. If someone shows any of these symptoms, even if the symptoms go away, call 9-1-1 and get the person to the hospital immediately. Check the time so you'll know when the first symptoms appeared. The longer the delay of treatment, the more severe the damage can be.






